THERE ARE BARRIERS IN:

- 1. having births registered,
- 2. changing sex or gender markers on official documents, and
- 3. being forced into unwanted sex or gender categories

Discrimination and stigmatization

INTERSEX PERSONS CAN BE SUBJECTED TO DISCRIMINATION AND ABUSE AS THEY ARE PERCEIVED "NOT TO CONFORM TO SEX AND GENDER NORMS".

Addressing human rights violations

Efforts should focus on:

- Lack of awareness
- Misconceptions
- Harmful social and religious attitudes
- Stigma and taboos that perpetuate human rights violations and prevent people from speaking out
 Lack of visibility

- Lack of access to information, peer support and legal services
- Legacy of concealment of medical practices from individuals and from society
- Lack of non-pathologizing information on intersex

Historic Breakthrough (Philippines)

January 12, 2005- Regional Trial Court (RTC) granted the petition

Sept.12, 2008-Supreme Court affirmed the decision of RTC Siniloan to grant change of name and sex marker to Jeff Cagandahan

Sept. 18, 2019-The Diocese of San Pablo granted Jeff to update his church records

Republic Act 9048

Allows city or municipal civil registrar or the consul general to correct clerical or typographical errors in an entry, and/or change the first name or nickname in the civil register without a judicial order.

This law has not been tested by intersex people.

- * Submitted a joint report with Intersex Asia on the Committee on the Rights of the Child (CRC)
- *Submitted a joint report with Society of Trans Women of the Philippines (STRAP) and the International Women's Rights Action Watch Asia Pacific to the working group on violence against women and girls in the context of poverty and inequality.
